# Vocabulary and definitions

Word	Definition
Pencil	The basic tool for drawing, can be used for linear work or for
	shading.
Biro	Drawings can be completed in biro and shaded using hatching or
	cross hatching.
Pastel	Oil and chalk pastels can be used to blend colours smoothly, chalk
(chalk/oil)	pastels give a lighter effect.
Coloured	Coloured pencils can be layered to bend colours, some are water
pencil	soluble.
Acrylic paint	A thick heavy paint that can be used smoothly or to create texture.
Water colour	A solid or liquid paint that is used watered down and layered.
Gouache	A pure pigment paint that can be used like watercolours or more
	thickly for an opaque effect.
Sketching	To use light strokes of the pencil to create a continuously changing
	line when drawing something.
Materials	The same as media but can also refer to the basis of the art work e.g.
	canvas, paper, clay.
